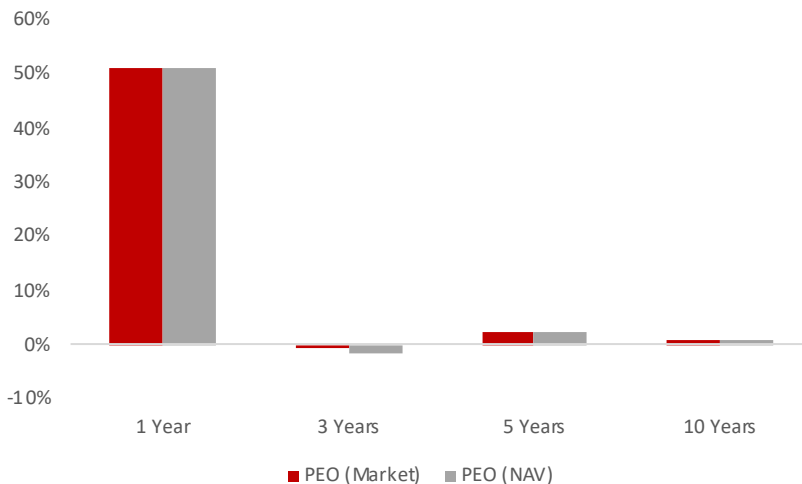

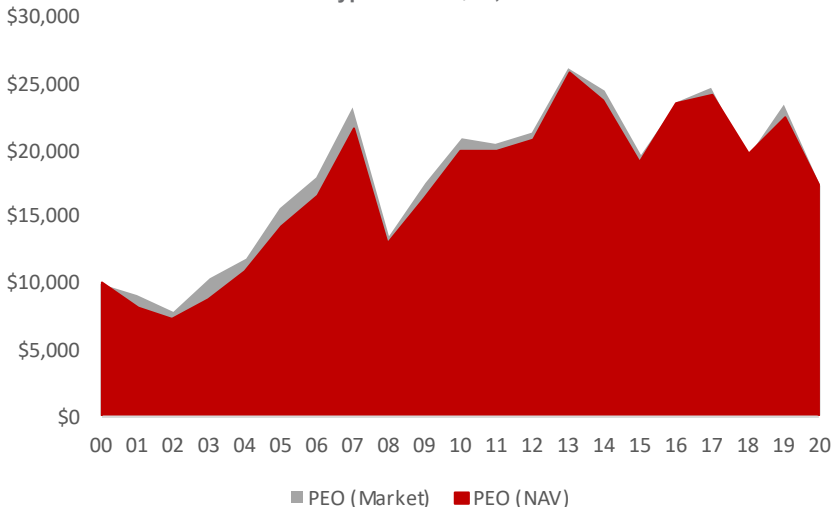

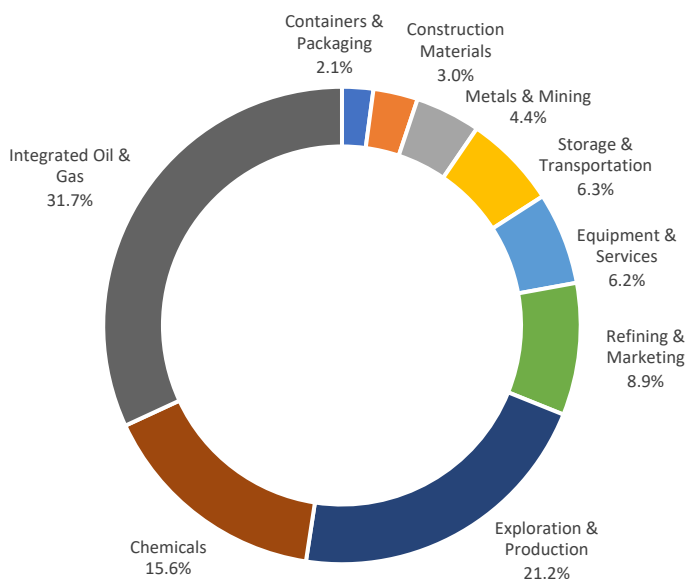
Growth of Hypothetical \$10,000 Investment
